Minister's Musings April 2022

As I write this, we are in the middle of Lent and working our way through a deep dive into Psalm 23 (in worship) and some difficult words of Jesus (in Wed. night Bible study). Not only is Lent a lengthy liturgical season, but it feels like we have been in a 2-year long Lenten season! With the arrival of April and the daily gradual increase in light, we begin to look forward to Easter – to resurrection hope – to the new life it engenders.

After 2 years of a global pandemic, many of us are seeking sources of new life. For some, it means looking for opportunities to gather with people (while wondering how to revive atrophied social skills). For some it means delving deeply into an interest or passion. For some it means spring-cleaning and decluttering. (The New York Times suggests our brains need a spring-cleaning too!) For others it means a new adventure.

First Presbyterian is launching on a new adventure, and I'm excited about the new life it may bring. Beginning in May we will work with LeaderWise (a consulting, coaching, and counseling group in the Twin Cities) and go through their 14-month CrossForm program. Here is how the LeaderWise staff members describe it:

"We live in a time of rapid, discontinuous and chaotic change. Our structures are not sufficient to support the transformation that change demands. Our training has not equipped us for the journey on which we find ourselves. Yet chaos is often the prerequisite for the in-breaking of God's new creation. For such a time as this, God has called us to CrossForm!

CrossForm is a unique approach to equipping congregations for 21st century ministry. Our focus is threefold: strengthening **core** around identity, vision and mission, building **flexibility** around program and structure, and deepening **impact** or the flourishing of community."

We are currently working on identifying the team (pastor and 4-5 laypeople) who will attend the CrossForm immersions and who will work with the congregation. One of the primary criteria for team members is an openness to transformation and change. This will be an exciting (and at times challenging) adventure of discernment, learning, and new life!

And speaking of *new life* . . . **Sabbatical**. My clergy renewal sabbatical is now 2 months away. I expect that this sacred time will be life-giving for me and for the congregation. While I experience the blessing of time to rest, to play, to create, and to feed my spirit, you all will have a very creative summer as well. (Under the leadership of Sara Gannon, "While the Kat's away the church will play!"). According to information on the Lilly Clergy Renewal Grant website, "When a pastor is gone on sabbatical, the church will often learn that God can still work through them. They learn to take greater ownership for the church's ministry."

A clergy sabbatical is unique from vacation time and does not take the place of it. A sabbatical allows disengagement from the usual tasks of ministry and offers time for renewal. It will be a much-needed time of restoration – of *resurrection* – leading to new energy, ideas, and spiritual growth. I am grateful. More information will be forthcoming.

As we continue to move through the season of Lent, we anticipate Easter and new life.

Session Summary – Meeting of March 15, 2022

Session news for April 2022 Bellwether

The Session held a stated meeting via Zoom on March 15, 2022. All Ruling Elders and Pastor Kathy were in attendance. Also, in attendance were Tim Nieman, Clerk of Session and Cindy Halvorson from LeaderWise, a Twin Cities church and clergy leadership development organization used by the Presbyterian Church, USA. Cindy provided an overview of CrossForm, one of the programs offered by LeaderWise which empowers pastors and congregations to provide effective ministry in our rapidly changing society. Thanks to a generous grant from the Presbytery of Northern Waters, our congregation will participate in the CrossForm experience. The Session approved participation.

A motion was approved to confirm the email vote of the Session taken to permit transfer of \$15,000 from the endowment (celebration) fund to the general fund to cover mandatory expenses in March. The Session also approved a motion from the finance committee to increase the quarterly transfer from the endowment (celebration) fund to the general fund. The amount is increased from \$4,500 to \$6,000 per quarter. The purpose of the transfer is to help make up the difference between budgeted expenses and anticipated income. The Session also approved a motion to permit the immediate transfer of funds from the endowment (celebration) fund to the general fund to maintain a positive balance if the quarterly transfers are insufficient. The Session is to be notified promptly if any such transfer is made.

There was much discussion about the current status of church finances. The finance committee, Treasurer and celebration fund committee are working on a comprehensive analysis of the current financial situation for the Session and congregation. Due to the death of Keith Daniels, the position of Financial Administrator is currently vacant. Those duties will be assumed by the finance committee for the time being. The amount of annual college scholarship funds awarded by the church was discussed and will be reviewed further at the next Session meeting.

The next stated meeting of the Session will be Tuesday, April 12, 2022 at 5:30 pm via Zoom.




Lenten Daily Devotional: Making the Road: Walking through Lent


Lenten Study: The Difficult Words of Jesus by Amy Jill Levine
